SCRAN is used in schools, is available in museums, libraries, galleries, and archives media (pictures and videos) from national collections and private collections. Find out more about how SCRAN resources can provide a great stimulus for reminiscence, oral history gathering and interpretation, how resources can be accessed and used to support intergenerational work.

Donna Holford-Lovell will be telling us about the Memory Box Network which provides an online reminiscence therapy service to people affected by dementia. Based in Dundee the organisation is committed to using digital media in an innovative way to provide a 'free-to-end-user' online service that can positively affect the quality of life of those affected by dementia. We will undertake a short workshop with Donna.

Yvonne Coull will introduce the new Health and Well Being resource from GWT. There will be an opportunity to hear about activities from those round the table along with the general update from GWT and funding information.
