## WHAT TYPE OF PROJECT COULD I RUN?



**ENERGY EFFICIENCY** - You could hold an event to raise awareness of energy that is being wasted in your school, sports hall or at home. Even little things like unplugging mobile phones when they have finished charging and not leaving electrical items on standby can reduce energy use and add up to make a difference to our carbon footprint.



**RESOURCES** - Cutting down on the amount of new stuff we buy can help reduce carbon footprint. You could organise a clothing swap shop. Or maybe you have another idea to help people reuse and recycle?



**FOOD** - You could encourage people to grow their own fruit and veg in a school, community garden or at home. Or maybe you could draw up a list of local suppliers and publicise it to the local community?



**TRANSPORT** - You could run a project to encourage your classmates and community to use lower carbon forms of transport such as public transport, lift shares, walking, cycling, skating or scooting instead of driving.



**YOUR OWN IDEA** - Alternatively, maybe you have another idea to reduce carbon emissions and help tackle climate change. If so, we'd love to hear from you!
