## Issues to be considered.

<p>Aim and objectives of the project (What are the priority areas?)</p>	
<p>Who will be on your planning group?</p> <p>What organisations/groups can you partner with and where can you find out about these groups?</p>	
<p>How will you recruit younger and older participants?</p> <p>How many participants will there be?</p>	
<p>What type of activities do you think might work for the objectives/priorities areas your project will aim to address?</p>	
<p>Where will the project take place?</p> <p>Are there any venue costs or other costs?</p> <p>Where can you source additional funding (if required)?</p>	

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<p>How long will the project run – number of weeks, length of each session – can it be sustained beyond the structured project?</p>	
<p>What barriers might this project face? Can you anticipate any?</p>	
<p>What are the main outcomes/ benefits for your organisation and participants involved?</p>	
<p>Evaluation How will you record and collate your results?</p> <p>How will you measure the impact of bringing the different generations together (impact = outcomes minus the amount that would have occurred anyway)?</p> <p>How will you celebrate your project?</p>
