Local Update

- Sarah & Tina, First Step Nursery shared their intergenerational project, Stepping Together. The overarching aim was to increase physical activity for the children and for elders in the community. The sessions included an initial introductory session inviting the elders into the children's environment, arts & crafts, nature walks, physical activity games, cold cooking, gardening then a celebration at the end. This was the nursery's first intergenerational project and they were delighted with the feedback from everyone involved. It was clear that the children and elders were both talking about each other out with the sessions and that there were connections made between the generations. Although the project was really successful the staff plan to make some changes for the next project which include different evaluation tools, having a backup session in case something falls through or the weather is bad and filming the project to showcase. They also want to move to weekly sessions instead of monthly.
