The need for intergenerational approaches

Communities across Scotland are becoming increasingly fragmented, with fewer opportunities for different generations to live, work, and play together.



People in younger age groups (16-24) are

three times

more likely to experience loneliness than people aged over 65

of people over 50 prefer to spend their time with people of a mix of ages

The need for social distancing during the pandemic only exacerbated these issues, with one million more people in the UK becoming “chronically lonely”.¹

Media portrayals of generational differences often perpetuate negative images, encouraging suspicion and fear. If we fail to address these negative trends, we risk creating a country where both younger and older people experience more social isolation and loneliness.

With your help, we can make Scotland an intergenerational nation!



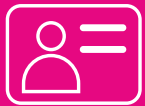
