- Presentation included: Intergenerational vs. Multigenerational, mutual benefit, role of intergenerational projects in generating 'upstream' improvements to health and wellbeing (particularly in tackling social isolation), how spaces and places are key to achieving effective IG output and how GWT can support this.

Local Updates

- Torry Development trust (Lorna, David and Alec) currently working on outdoor intergenerational projects, including the development of a community housing village.
- Discussion on barriers to IG work, with PVGs cited as a common barrier.
- Louise from University of Aberdeen spoke about a lack of opportunity for university students to engage in intergenerational practice. Hopeful that this is something that can gradually change and begin to be recognised and implemented by both universities and local community groups.
- Dave Salmond is working with Bucksburn academy (an Excelerate school) and is in the process of developing a street art project and is also tying with a men's shed to explore opportunities for intergenerational design and tech classes. These are in the planning phase, so we are excited to see how they progress.
- Jess from Deveron Projects has been leading on a variety of intergenerational projects in Huntley for a while.
- Mandy spoke about how a previous intergenerational project she had led on had failed, as participants perhaps didn't understand how project was intended to work. A good discussion on the importance of briefing participants in advance and ensuring that they understand the project followed.
- Sharon from AVA has recently set up a new network for all things volunteering in the Aberdeenshire area. This provides updates on a large range of upcoming events, projects etc. which members can tie in with.
