Orkney Isles Network Update

Pamela shared about the project which she has been involved with – school children and older people playing board games. Pamela had followed information gleamed from Generations Working Together resources as well as from the one-day training, to create an intergenerational project from her initial idea.

Pamela followed instructions from planning through to evaluation and had gathered some valuable evidence showing the positive impact which an intergenerational project has on changing preconceived stereotypes, confidence building and well being of participants. In depth details of Pamela's project can be found in a separate attachment.

Steph shared about the power of dance changing lives and her projects involving young dancers supporting older people with dementia. Steph was enthusiastic about taking her intergenerational model into care homes and to the wider community. Lynda from Smiddybrae House Care Home reiterated the positive impact the interactions had on the residents.

There was discussion on how intergenerational activities took place organically on the Orkney Isles, and various activities were shared. The discussions were also counter discussed by those who had attended the one-day training as they sated that the activities which took place on the islands were more multigenerational rather than intergenerational. Further discussion was had and the possibilities of working collaboratively to create purposeful interactions.

Who is missing from around the table? Names were suggested and a call to Headteachers to attend was suggested for the next meeting. It was shared that all headteachers were invited to the meeting by Pamela. Louisa to contact them to see if there are obstacles which could be addressed to enable them to attend the meeting. There was a suggestion that at the next Network meeting that everyone brings someone new along.
